



The Marie Sklodowska-Curie Individual Fellowships

Are you a postdoctoral researcher thinking about your next career move? The Marie Sklodowska-Curie (MSCA) Individual Fellowships may be just right for you. These fellowships fund researchers looking to enhance their career development and prospects by working abroad. KU Leuven – being one of the leading European universities - allows you to work in a first class research environment while benefitting from an attractive remuneration package.

The Individual Fellowships in a nutshell

Who can apply?

- Individual Fellowships are intended for promising researchers from anywhere in the world.
- Only experienced researchers can apply. This means you will have your doctoral degree or at least four years' full-time research experience by the time of the call deadline.
- Mobility across borders is a must.

What can be funded? All research areas can be funded.

Types of Individual Fellowships

There are two types of Individual Fellowships:

European Fellowships

- Held in a EU Member State or an associated country.
- Last from one to two years.
- Open to researchers either coming to Europe or moving within Europe.
- Can help to restart research careers after a break such as parental leave.
- Can also help reintegrate researchers coming back to Europe.

Global Fellowships

- Fund research stays (one to two years) outside Europe for researchers based in in <u>a EU Member State or an associated country.</u>
- There is a mandatory one year return period to Europe.

Both types can also include a secondment period of up to 3 or 6 months in another organisation in Europe, where this can boost the impact of the fellowship.

What does the funding cover? The grant provides an allowance to cover your living, travel and family costs. The research costs and overhead of the host organisation(s) are also supported.

Eligibility checks and finding a supervisor

The KU Leuven EU team can assist you with verifying your eligibility and finding a supervisor affiliated with KU Leuven. Contact us at your earliest convenience (eu-info@kuleuven.be).



Travel allowance application (deadline 14 April 2016).

Applicants living outside of Belgium can apply for a travel allowance to attend the Master class.

Master class (23-24 June 2016)

The Master class is intended to get to know KU Leuven and your future supervisor and research group, and in addition includes an in depth proposal writing clinic. Registration will open shortly.

Draft proposal writing (June-July)

Applicants register themselves and their proposal in the online <u>Participant Portal</u> using the validated PIC of KU Leuven (999991334). Applicants write their proposal with input and support from their supervisor and the EU team.

Feedback on the proposal (August)

Applicants should send their draft proposal (80% ready) to the EU team for feedback.

Final deadline (14 September 2016)
